Acts 1:8

⁸ *But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”*

Acts 2:22

²² *“Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know.*

Hebrews 13:8

⁸ *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.*

Philippians 2:6-11

⁶ *Who, being in very nature God,
did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;
⁷ rather, he made himself nothing
by taking the very nature of a servant,
being made in human likeness.
⁸ And being found in appearance as a man,
he humbled himself
by becoming obedient to death—
even death on a cross!
⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place
and gave him the name that is above every name,
¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.*

There’s a difference between *hearing* about Jesus and *knowing* Jesus.

John 8:32

³² *Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.”*

Know: to have learned something, to have a working understanding, to have experience with something

Jeremiah 1:5

⁵ *“Before I formed you in the womb I knew you...*

When we really start getting it, truth goes from being information to revelation to transformation.

Repentance: feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one's wrongdoing or sin.

From a Biblical standpoint, it is about *changing direct*

Proverbs 28:13

¹³ *Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper,
but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy.*

Psalms 32:3-5

³ *When I kept silent,
my bones wasted away
through my groaning all day long.*

⁴ *For day and night
your hand was heavy on me;
my strength was sapped
as in the heat of summer.*

⁵ *Then I acknowledged my sin to you
and did not cover up my iniquity.*

*I said, “I will confess
my transgressions to the LORD.”*

*And you forgave
the guilt of my sin.*
