The Way of Agape Part 4 – Love Came Down December 6, 2020

Isaiah 57:15

15 For this is what the high and exalted One says—
he who lives forever, whose name is holy:
"I live in a high and holy place,
but also with the one who is contrite and lowly in spirit,
to revive the spirit of the lowly
and to revive the heart of the contrite.

Agape is a Greek word for God's perfect, unconditional love.

The highest form of love – it is selfless, sacrificial, and unconditional. A perfect love that transcends our human capabilities and capacity.

Agape love is defined as: The love of God for man. A love originating from God for mankind.

It is directional...from God to us.

Agape love means God is willing to come down to where we are.

God's agape love is the prescription for an ailing heart.

A love like God's requires a response.

Our lowliness does not annoy God. On the contrary, He is moved by it.

God is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.

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Contrite: feeling or expressing remorse or penitence; affected by guilt. An awareness of two things: Our own brokenness and our need for God.

God's agape love should draw us to repentance!
