Redemption requires action.

Romans 3:23-24

²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

Redemption starts and ends with Jesus.

Satan meant Jesus' death to be a defeat – God meant it to redeem the world.

Act 2:24

²⁴ But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him.

1 Corinthians 15:54-55

54 ... "Death has been swallowed up in victory."

55 "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

What if the very thing meant to defeat you is actually being used by God to redeem you?
